Ella carefully sniffs a pile of soil, working hard to detect any scent of human decomposition. The highly-trained cadaver dog is

part of a larger team that was on the ground in rural Acton last weekend, searching for traces of Marianne Schuett, a 10-year-old Kilbride girl who was abducted on her way home from school in

While 54 years have passed, the volunteer group — led by two retired police investigators with a passion for cold cases - remains hopeful that their efforts will bring closure for a grieving family once and for all.

It doesn't take Ella long to find what she's looking for. She sits down beside the soil and barks excitedly - her method of indicating that she's discovered the human scent she's trained to pick up. The forensic dig team claps and cheers.
