CATCH-UP CLINICS OPEN FOR SCHOOL-BASED VACCINATIONS

The Halton Region Public Health is currently operating community immunization clinics to help students catch up on Hepatitis B, HPV and Meningococcal vaccines.

"As our COVID-19 vaccination clinics wind down, public health is ready to get our student population caught up on their schoolbased vaccines, which are critical for protecting the health and safety of our school community," said Dr. Hamidah Meghani, Halton's medical officer of health.

"This program will leverage the successes from our COVID-19 clinics, including many of the clinic locations, resources, supplies and technology, to efficiently implement these mass clinics and begin catching up students as

quickly as possible."

The delivery of school-based vaccinations was paused when the pandemic hit and there are currently 30,000 students born between 2004 and 2009 who require at least one of three vaccines. Post-secondary

students born in 2002 and 2003 will also have the opportunity to receive missed vaccines.

Residents are able to book an appointment through Halton's online booking system at halton.ca/immunize.

Clinics are planned for each municipality and are expected to run until mid-November at the Gellert Community Centre in Georgetown, Gary Allan Learning Centre in Burlington, FirstOntario Arts Centre in Milton and YMCA in Oakville.

In addition to the launch of school-based community immunization clinics, public health will continue to operate two COVID-19 vaccination sites through September at the YMCA in Oakville and FirstOntario Arts Centre in Milton. Walk-in appointments only.
