"Five other women from Halton Hills were also selected (Abigail Scott, Cassidy Warner, Sara Aresenault, Shayne Klimsiak, and Sophia Jesus). I speak for all of the women that attended Camp Molly 2021 that it was an unforgettable experience.

"I made so many new friendships and learned about fire suppression, fire investigation, water rescue, auto extraction and many more attributes of the fire service. I am so thankful I got to experience Camp Molly and I felt like I belonged right when I stepped foot in the fire department."

A fitting tribute Saturday, Oct. 2 was the Henry Thomas Shepherd Park dedication. Mr. Shepherd was a Georgetown resident, veteran of both the First and Second World Wars, the first Black chief of the Georgetown Fire Department, a founding member of the Royal Canadian Legion (Branch 120), a member of the Lorne Scots and a well-respected member of our town.

His legacy remains strong among the residents of Halton Hills and surrounding communities.

The Halton Hills community overwhelmingly supported the park being renamed to honour Mr. Shepherd.
