## NEW YOUTH CENTRE OPENS IN ACTON

Acton's new youth centre, offering an expanded range of services, opened earlier this month.

The new centre, located at 19 Willow St., provides a place for youth to socialize, collaborate and access local services.

"I come here a lot to do crafts, hang out with friends, play some games or some pool tournaments," said Emily, who has been going to centre for three years.

Work on the new centre began late last year and officially opened Oct. 5, replacing the previous youth centre that was on Mill Street

The features of the new centre include:

· a patio

· a lounge with a pool table and entertainment pods

· uniquely designed conversational pods with computer stations for homework or small group work

- two community rooms for independent work, counselling and meetings
- · a kitchen with access to food
- · shower and laundry services
- · access to community services for youth

"To be able to construct and open this centre, during a pandemic, is a testament to our community's resilience and strength," said Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette. "The Acton Youth Centre has been set up as a one-stop shop for youth that supports and enhances recreational opportunities,

mental health, and other services that support youth in navigating community resources."

Donations from the Rotary Club of Acton, the Halton Hills Service Club Collaborative and the S.A.W. Memo-Golf Tournament helped with construction and providing amenities for the centre.

Halton Hills operates two vouth centres — the other at Gary Allan High School (96 Guelph St., Georgetown). Both centres are operated by trained staff in partnership with social service agencies, including Reach Out Centre for Kids (ROCK), ADAPT and Support House.

The youth centre services are provided free of charge to youth between the ages of 12 and 24.

"This fully accessible facility offers a variety of recreational opportunities and amenities to support and encourage youth to thrive," said Steve Hamilton, manager of facility capital projects for the Town of Halton

"I've been going to the youth centre for about five years," said Tristan. "It's a great place to hang out and meet new people. That's my favourite part, but they also have really good games and fun stuff to do."

Located in the old Acton Town Hall, the town worked with Heritage Acton to preserve heritage features of the building.
