Help shape the future of waste management in Halton

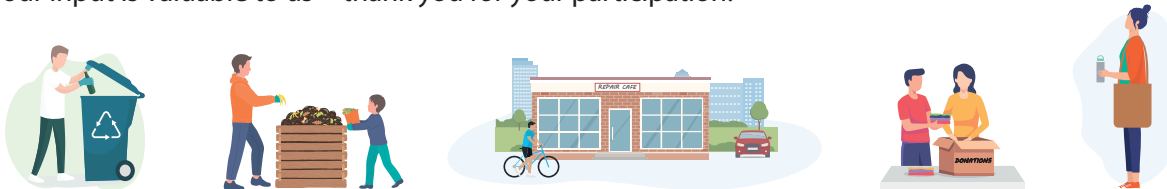
Reducing community waste and protecting the natural environment have always been top priorities for Halton Region and for our residents. Through your participation in our waste diversion programs, we have extended the life of our landfill by more than 30 years—but there is still more we can do!

Our proposed Solid Waste Management Strategy includes medium (four to 10 years) and long-term (11+ years) initiatives that will help the Region increase our waste diversion rate, further extend the life of the Halton Waste Management Site (landfill) and reduce carbon emissions.
