COMMUNITY SPIRIT STRONG FOR WEBATHON

The Community Foundation of Halton North (CFHN) raised \$100,000 in its first webathon.

"The Board of CFHN was pleased to lead this first ever webathon that will provide support to many charities serving Halton Hills and Milton," said CFHN chair Brad Clements.

The hybrid event combined 10 hours of online programming as well as a CFNH presence at both the Milton and Georgetown Farmer's Market and the foundation's new office at 18 Martin St. in Milton.

The online portion of the event featured a series of interviews and videos highlighting the importance of the combined efforts of CFHN, local charities and sponsors have within the community.

Each charity had time during the webathon to feature the work they do through stories and videos. Featured were the Halton Learning Foundation, Community Living North Halton, Reach Out Centre for Kids (ROCK), Halton Hills Public Library, Milton District Hospital Foundation, Townsend-Smith Foundation, Canadian Caribbean Association of Halton, Art-Spark through the Town of Milton and Links2Care. The in-person portion brought together residents and elected officials from Halton Hills and Milton and representatives of CFHN and local charities. In addition to raising funds, CFHN hoped to educate the public on the importance of providing support and continuing to grow endowments that are granted back to the community every year.

"CFHN also makes it very convenient to donate once, knowing it will flow throughout the community to many causes, now and forever," said CFHN board member Darryl Demille.

CFHN has a current endowment of \$4.7 million and has distributed almost \$850,000 in grants to charities in Milton and Halton Hills since it was established in 2015.
