■ NEWS HIGH SCHOOLS TO BEGIN 4-COURSE PER DAY SCHEDULE

All secondary schools in Halton region will change to a four-course per day schedule beginning next week, the Halton District School Board announced Monday (Nov. 22).

Beginning Nov. 29, all secondary schools in the Halton District School Board will change to a four-course per day schedule. A four-course per day schedule is referred to as a traditional Semester Model, the board said.

The timing of this change for next Monday ensures "we will keep the balance between Week 1 and Week 2 courses," the board added. This falls in line with the Ontario Ministry of Education announcement last week that Ontario school boards can move to a four-course per day schedule for secondary schools, in consultation with local public health units.

"We know that many students, staff and

families have been looking forward to this announcement," the Board said in a notification to parents.

The board said because of this "we are pleased to inform you" about the change. Since September 2021, HDSB schools have followed the Modified Semester Model as well as offered co-curricular activities for students learning in-person, the Board said.

"Given the high rates of vaccination among youth aged 12 to 17 and the diligence among students and staff in practising CO-VID-19 health and safety protocols, we have seen a reduction in the number and frequency of COVID-19 cases among secondary school students, and we are now able to safely move to a Semester Model," the board said. "This decision is in accordance with Ministry of Education requirements and has been made with consultation from Halton Region Public Health."
