You do not need garbage bag tags on the first garbage collection after Christmas Day. The six garbage bag/can limit applies.



Please make sure containers and bags are visible to collection crews, and are free of snow and ice. Do not place on top of snowbanks or on the road surface to ensure streets are clear for snow removal.



Christmas trees will be picked up during the weeks of January 11 and 18, 2022 on your scheduled collection day. Please remove all decorations, tree stands and plastic bags prior to collection.

General waste collection tips:

- Place waste securely at the curb by 7 a.m. on collection day and no sooner than 5 p.m. the night before.
- Please ensure containers or bins weigh no more than 23 kg (50 lbs).
- Bag and tie all garbage and Green Cart material.
- Wrap mattresses and box springs in plastic before placing at the curb for bulk waste collection.

colour who may be facing discrimination.

"Having brown skin doesn't make vou a better teacher. However, there's something about living in brown skin that gives you a different perspective and makes you better equipped to handle issues such as discrimination or racism, which sadly is what racialized children still have to endure," said Fetepigi.

The delegation resulted in trustees placing a motion on the table addressing Fetepigi's request. It specifically asked for information on staff demographics, a report on board efforts to recruit minority talent, details of efforts that have been made and evidence of how the board has been committed to equity and inclusion.

The motion did face opposition around the board table by trustees who posed questions around privacy concerns or specifically what the staff report should be looking for. One trustee questioned how the word "minority" was defined in the context.

Trustee Nancy Guzzo expressed surprise about the de-

"We are simply asking for a staff report on the demographics of our student bodies and our staff. I don't think that there should be any further discussion, and the fact that it's even being debated blows my mind," said

The motion ultimately passed with five trustees voting in favour — Guzzo, Brenda Agnew, Marvin Duarte, Patrick Murphy and Janet O'Hearn-Czarnota. Trustees Tim O'Brien, Peter De-Rosa and Vincent Iantomasi voted against. Trustee Helena Karabela abstained.

The report is expected back before the Dec. 21 board meeting.
