SUSPECTS SOUGHT IN ARMED ROBBERY OF PHARMACIES

Halton police are on the hunt for three suspects after a pair of alleged knife-point robberies in north Halton last Thursday night (Dec. 16), in which store employees were assaulted.

The first incident occurred around 5:45 p.m., when police were called to the IDA King Cove Pharmacy at 156 Guelph Street in Georgetown for a robbery that had just occurred.

Three suspects — one of whom was allegedly armed with a knife — entered the pharmacy and confronted the lone store employee demanding narcotics, police said.

During the confrontation, the employee was assaulted, but was not injured.

The suspects "ransacked the store" and quickly fled to an awaiting dark-coloured newer vehicle (no confirmation on make, model or licence plate), police said. The vehicle fled prior to the police's arrival.

Then, at around 6:30 p.m., police said, suspects entered the Glen Eden Pharmacy

at 400 Bronte Street South in Milton and, again, confronted the lone store employee.

A female employee was "pushed to the ground" while the suspects demanded narcotics and ransacked the store, police said in a news release.

Police believe the same suspects are responsible for both robberies.

All suspects are described as being aged 15 to 17, wearing dark coloured hoodies and track pants and dark face coverings.
