DRUG OVERDOSES ON THE RISE IN HALTON

POLICE TARGET TRAFFICKERS CONTRIBUTING TO OVERDOSE CRISIS

The following is part two in a four-part Halton series on crime in the region. Next week, see part three focusing on frauds and scams in the region.

Halton police are sounding

the alarm as the number of drug overdoses being reported in Halton Hills and across the region continues to soar.

The local department says they attended 50 per cent more suspected drug overdose — or drug poisoning — calls last year versus 2020, jumping from 241 to 361. This includes opioid and non-opioid overdoses that were both accidental and intentional.

There was also a notable increase of 37 per cent in how many of those calls turned fatal, with police reporting that 52 Halton residents lost their lives to suspected drug poisoning in 2021—

the first full calendar year of life in the COVID-19 pandemic.

"It's absolutely crisis level — capital C on crisis. That's certainly not an overstatement," said Jennifer Hartman, Halton Regional Police Service's manager of corporate communications.

"Everything you hear about
