# TOWN LIFTS COVID-19 STATE OF EMERGENCY

The Town of Halton Hills has lifted its pandemic-related state of emergency.

Mayor Rick Bonnette said he rescinded the declaration March 21 at 11:30 a.m., following suit with other municipalities in Halton.

The local state of emergency was in place for almost two years. With the town having to react quickly to new information released throughout the pandemic from federal, provincial and regional governments, the emergency declaration granted the mayor and chief administrative officer the ability to make decisions as required without the approval of committees or council.

In other local pandemic news, regional council voted at a special meeting to rescind Halton's mask bylaw to align with provincial mandates being lifted, effective

March 21.

"I encourage all Halton residents to continue to be kind and respectful to everyone, regardless of their decision to wear a mask or not," said Halton Medical Officer of Health Dr. Hamidah Meghani.

Masks will still be required in certain settings, such as public transit, long-term care, retirement homes and hospitals.
