Halton residents are invited to attend the Spring Compost Giveaway happening May 9–15 as a thank you for helping divert approximately 30,000 tonnes of yard waste last year. During the event, Halton residents can take up to the equivalent of seven bags of compost per household.

Who: This event is open to residents of Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville. Visitors may be asked for proof of residency.


