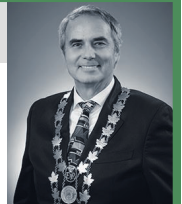
Please bag and tie all garbage material. Place Green Cart items in paper or BPI-certified bags and seal before placing at the curb. **Loose items will not be collected.**
