If you want to explore the wonders of wildlife in Ontario, make sure you are prepared and know what's expected when visiting.


Here are some epic destinations to cross off your bucket-list.

Top 10 for best sunsets. Its rare oak Savanna and coastal dune ecosystems has over 800 vascular plants and over 300 bird species. If you're planning to explore the Old Ausable Channel, a provincially-significant wetland, you can rent a canoe, hydro bike, paddle boat or kayaks. Visitors start coming in May until Labour Day.
