HOUSE PRICES DROPPING IN HALTON HILLS

House prices overall in Georgetown and Acton are on the decline.

The Toronto Regional Real Estate Board (TRREB) released its June numbers, and it shows some interesting trends for Halton Hills.

Overall, sales in the town were down, from 83 in May to 72 last month, and the average price of all home types in Halton Hills also dipped, according to the report.

In June, the average price of a home in Halton Hills was \$1,179,660, down from \$1,269,171 in May.

When it comes to detached homes, the decline is greater, according to the report.

The average price of a detached home in Halton Hills last month sold for \$1,303,862, a 10 per cent drop from May when a detached home here sold for \$1,441,793.

continued to impact home sales in June. In the GTA, sales totalled 6,474 — down by 41 per cent compared to last year at this time.

"Home sales have been impacted by both the affordability challenge presented by mortgage rate hikes and the psychological effect wherein homebuyers who can afford higher borrowing costs have put their decision on hold to see where home prices end up. Expect current market conditions to remain in place during the slower summer months. Once home prices stabilize, some buyers will re-enter the market despite higher borrowing costs," said TRREB president Kevin Crigger.
