

Excellent question. Child support can change over the years based on different changes in circumstances of the child and the parents. A big change is a child starting to attend post-secondary education. Generally, if the child is still living at home while attending postsecondary education then regular monthly child support is still payable. However, if the child is living away for postsecondary school, whether "on campus" or "off campus", regular monthly child support is usually suspended during the time the child is at school, and then is only payable if and when the child returns to live with the recipient parent, typically in the summer months. This presumes the child is attending postsecondary school full time and is not able to financially support him or herself. As the child may be an adult although still in school, if the child is working a fair amount, then some consideration may be given to the financial means available to the child to support him or herself.
