# It's Our Own Garbage

#### What We Did in 2021

Thank you Halton residents!

By participating in Blue Box, Green Cart, Yard Waste, Reuse and Household Hazardous Waste programs, as well as diversion programs at the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS), Halton residents continue to maintain a high residential waste diversion rate. In 2021, 58 per cent of residential waste was diverted from the landfill.

Also, through our shared commitment, we have helped to extend the lifespan of the landfill from 2012 to between 2044 and 2048—over 30 years longer than expected. This has saved taxpayers more than \$15 million by deferring the costs of building a new site.

## **Halton Solid Waste Management Advisory Committee**

The Committee was established as a Condition of Approval for the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS) when it opened in 1992. The Committee is comprised of members from Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville. The Committee advises Halton Regional Council regarding programs and strategies to promote the 3Rs—reduce, reuse, recycle—encourage community recycling and minimize the amount of waste going to the landfill. In 2021, the primary focus was to update Committee members about Halton Region waste management programs, the changes to programs and status of Extended Producer Responsibility programs under the Waste Free Ontario Act, and the development of a new Solid Waste Management Strategy that was approved by Region Council in May 2022.



### **Diversion Results**

Here is a summary of waste material diverted from the Halton Region landfill site in 2021:

- Blue Box: 52,146 tonnes
- Green Cart: 34,348 tonnes
- Yard Waste: 30,186 tonnes
- Household Hazardous Waste: 861 tonnes
- Electronic Waste: 387 tonnes
- Other: 22,681 tonnes

We diverted more waste than we landfilled: 140,609 tonnes! Total garbage landfilled at the Halton Waste Management Site: 77,072 tonnes.
