# POLICE WARNING OF ALLEGED DOOR-TO-DOOR HOME REPAIR SCAM

Halton police have issued a warning about an alleged home repair scam believed to be operating in the region.

During July, police said, individuals claiming to be contractors attended two homes in Burlington where they convinced the elderly residents to let them do some repair work.

The suspects reportedly provided quotes with prices lower than market value, and then requested a large cash deposit. In each of the two incidents, police said, the residents handed this money over.

Police allege the repair work started, howev-

er, in each case the work was either subpar and/or incomplete. It's alleged the residents were then asked for more money for supplies or to complete payment for the project.

Police say once this additional or final payment was received, the contractors disappeared, and phone calls and text messages went unanswered leaving the homeowners with a damaged property or partially completed project.

The two alleged victims in Burlington reportedly lost \$5,000 each.

Police believe other people in Halton, as well as outside the region, may have been impacted by this alleged scam.

The suspects are described as two white men

with Irish or possibly Scottish accents. They are both described as being 25 to 35 years old, and approximately five-foot-nine to six-foot tall with heavy builds.

The first man is described as having dark-black hair while the second individual had short light-blond or light-brown hair and a moustache. In each incident, the suspects had a younger man with them claiming to be the son of one of the suspects.
