But we are only human. Despite our very best efforts, including robust copy editing and diligent fact-checking, mistakes albeit rarely.

When they do, we are quick to set the record straight. We issue a correction, acknowledging we made an error, and we provide readers with the accurate information. We do so with a certain level of transparency.

Online, we have the ability to update articles limited delays. with Changes cycle through the front end of our website almost immediately. An editor's note is always included in the body of the article to alert readers that the story was updated from its original version as a result of an error.

In print, a correction notice referencing the article is published along with the accurate information. Since we only publish weekly, we are limited as to how quickly we can right any wrongs. We must wait until the next print edition to do so. And that can mean several days before it reaches you, our reader, on your doorstep.

Readers turn to their trusted source of local news to make informed decisions, especially leading up to a vote. One misprint could impact your deci-


sion — and the outcome of the election.


