Local convenience store Acton Discount received \$8,762 for storefront renovations through a

town grant on October 6. Mayor Rick Bonnette and Ward 1 councillors presented the business with a cheque from the Commercial Façade Improvement Grant Program (CFIP) of-

ferred via the Community Improvement Program (CIP). Renovations — including painting, restoration of the historic brick and a new sign — aim to enhance customer experience

and contribute to the overall refurbishment of downtown Acton. "We are just extremely grateful that there's a program such as this that allows us to help beautify our business," said store owner SangWon Bak. Bak's family has owned and operated Acton Discount ? locat-

Commercial waste is not accepted. **For your safety, this event will operate with COVID-19 safety measures in place. Please expect longer than normal wait times when visiting the site.**

- Note: please pre-sort your materials prior to arrival. Household hazardous waste items will be collected first.

✓ Acceptable materials

- Acids (rust remover)
- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Automotive liquids (antifreeze, motor oil and filters)
- Batteries (household and car)
- Bleach
- Cosmetics and pharmaceuticals
- Fluorescent lights (compact bulbs and tubes)
- Fertilizers
- Fuels (must leave container)
- Garden chemicals
- Household cleaners
- Medications
- Mercury containing device
- Paint (full or partially full)
- Pesticides
- Pool chemicals
- Propane tanks and other pressurized containers
- Solvents
- Stains
- Varsols

Electronic waste



✓ Acceptable materials

- Desktop and portable computers
- Computer peripherals (routers, cables, chargers, USB)
- Display devices (TVs, computer monitors)
- Drones
- Audio/video systems (home, personal/portable, aftermarket vehicle)
- Home theaters in-a-box systems
- Camera and security cameras
- Musical instruments and recording equipment
- Floor standing printers and printer cartridges
- Video gaming systems and peripherals
- IT and telecom equipment (hard drives, servers, microfilm readers, binding machines, postage franking machines and check filler machines)
- Desktop printing/multi-function devices, 3D printers and printer cartridges
- Phones (telephones, cellular and smart phone devices, pagers)
- Additional items include, small appliances, Christmas lights and extension cords, small scrap metal

Reminder: Clear all personal information from computers, cell phones and electronics prior to drop off. Ensure all memory storage areas have been cleared of private information.

Household hazardous waste and electronic waste can also be dropped off year-round at the Halton Waste Management Site.
