## Knife pulled

A 24-year-old Georgetown man has been charged after a knife was pulled out during a fight Thursday.

At about 12:05 a.m., a man knocked on the door at an apartment on Raylawn Crescent. When the woman opened the door, a man pushed her aside, forced his way into the apartment and began threatening the 21-year-old woman.

Another male in the apartment went to aid of the woman and a scuffle between the two men started.

During the fight, the accused pulled a knife from under his jacket and began waving it around, police said.

The other man was pushed down a set of stairs and at one point his head smashed a window. He suffered minor injuries.

Police say the man threatened to kill the woman and that the couple were involved in a relationship that ended last year.

The man has been charged with forcible entry, assault, assault with a weapon and threatening death.

## Chain saws swiped

Six chain saws worth almost \$4,400 were removed from the shop at Blue Springs Golf Course sometime last Tuesday night.

According to police, someone went into the shop between 6 p.m. and 7 a.m. Wednesday and took five Stihl saws and a Pioneer.

## First look at budget possibilities

have several advantages, the report said. By establishing the town's spending plan earlier in the year, financial matters could be run more efficiently with better allocation of staff during a peak time of the year and the possibility of calling tenders earlier on various capital projects.

The report, which was to be considered Monday by council, proposes that council direct staff to prepare the 1993 preliminary budget so as not to exceed a 7.2 per cent tax increase. At the same time, staff would provide options to the budget committee to reduce the rate to 3.8 per cent, which represents the general rate of inflation plus additional costs related to the proposed Acton Arena. Council was also asked to approve the new budget timetable.

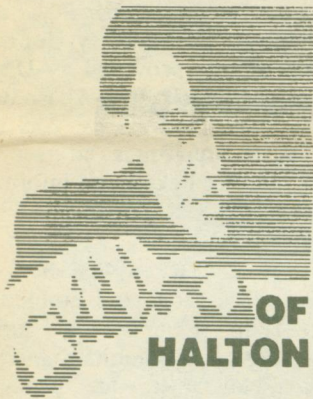

## CRIME STOPPERS

The Halton Regional Police in Burlington and Crime Stoppers of Halton are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the men responsible for a robbery at the Bank of Montreal in the Appleby Mall.

On Monday, August 31 at approximately 2:50 p.m., a man entered the Bank of Montreal at Appleby Mall situated at 5111 New Street in Burlington and presented a note to tellers advising of the robbery. Two tellers were ordered to comply with demands for cash and the robber left the bank and was seen getting into a blue or grey Chevette, driven by a second man.

The suspect is described as a male, white, 20 to 30 years of age, 5'6" to 5'10" tall. He had short, reddish, sandy brown hair and a couple of days growth of beard. he has a tattoo on his left forearm, described as green and black, a very intricate pattern, and appeared to be an old tattoo. He was wearing a white painter style cap with a Hamilton Tiger Cats logo on it, dark sunglasses, blue jeans and a brownish colored lumberjack shirt.
