Dick Willis, the founding chairman of Holcro, who died August 20. Willis' dedication to the project was not overlooked by many who addressed the crowd.

Christensen noted that a photo of Willis hangs in the lobby of the seniors' building, Rev. Cote said the lounge area of the building will be known as the Willis Lounge and Halton Hills Councillor Marilyn Serjeantson, who represented Halton Region at the opening, said, "This day would be totally complete if Dick was here. He was a dedicated force behind this 'dream come true.'

At the close of the ceremonies, a gift was presented to Willis' wife, Marg, on behalf of the board of directors of Holcro Non-Profit Housing Corporation. The corporation owns and operates the seniors' apartment.

While noting that the project drew some initial opposition from neighbors, Mayor Russ Miller said, the new building is "a credit to this town." He expressed hope that more of the same type of housing can be established in Halton Hills. "This is one of the finest-looking corners in Halton Hills," he said of the project.

In an interview following the ribbon-cutting, Christensen said the complex is totally non-denominational. There were 62 registered tenants as of last Wednesday and "an ample waiting list," he said. Christensen expressed confidence that the apartment will be fully occupied by mid-October.
