Raiders' officials are holding their breath hoping no bone chips are found in Roberts' elbow, which would limit his absence to only a



Promising rookies Galic, Kevin Moxey and Justin Parks, along with Jason Huminiuck and Jon McKee, both of whom have limited Jr. B experience with Newmarket and Mimico respectively, give Hanman talent but limited defensive experi-
