The Hunter

The guy at the coffee shop asked me if I was going hunting this fall. A normal question from this gentleman. He goes hunting and fishing several times each year -- and he brings back animals and fish! I decided that I would just say "No -no time this year." and let it go at that. If I ever told him of my hunting experiences, he would laugh me out of the shop.

I actually did go on three different hunting excursions before hanging up the firearms and retiring. The first experience was one of those weekend jaunts, to a cottage at Bobcaygeon, with the guys from the office. Some were avid duck hunters and some were avid poker players. Then I went on a serious deer and pearhunting trip to Tobermory. No fellowship and poker -- this was the real thing. We would set out at dawn and string out along a logging trail. The weather was balmy with pale

sunshine --November should be. I found a natural little clearing with what looked like a



bear's den in a huge rock face. I made myself comfortable on some pine boughs and was set to commune with nature for a few hours. I spent the next three hours whistling down other hunters, who would come crashing through the bush, then break out into my clearing with rifle at the ready! A bit unnerving for this hunter! I packed up and headed for my pick up point out on the highway.

I had one more fling at duck hunting on the Pine River near our old cottage on Lake Huron. I had noted that the ducks would fly in off the lake and up the river right before dusk. I had also spotted a natural blind in dense cedars which covered both river banks. So I parked myself in this blind with the old shot gun, just before dusk. A promised steak dinner would be waiting back at the cottage. It got darker and darker and I waited and waited. Not one duck in sight. Just me, standing in the dark, wondering why I wasn't back at the cottage with that steak and maybe a glass of wine, which Pat had promised. I finally said, enough is enough already. The steak and wine won out and I headed for the cottage.

was no sooner seated for dinner, telling Pat about the absence of ducks, when a war broke out over the river. Shot gun blasts rent the night -as they say. I not only hadn't seen any ducks -- I didn't even know the cedars were full of duck hunters!
