

CIBC perfect season has imperfect ending Arnie's grid team captures GLFFL title

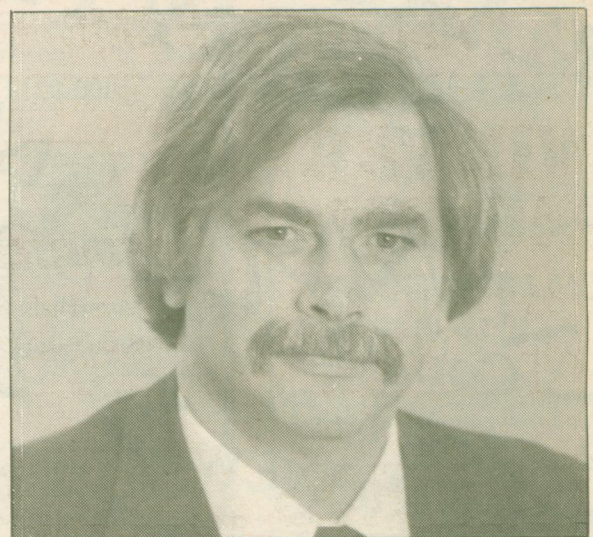
