• With an increase in confirmed cases of Avian Flu in wild birds, the Town of Halton Hills is informing residents on how they can protect themselves and their pets from contracting this virus.

Some prevention measures include: advoiding contact with wild birds and animals, keep pets leashed and away from birds & bird droppings, and consider temporarily removing or relocating bird feeders and baths.

If you do happen to come across a dead bird, you are being asked to report it to the Canadian Wildlife Health Cooperative by calling 1-866-673-4781 or online at cwhc-rcfs.ca.

• New signs promoting tourism in Halton Hills have been installed in Acton.
