

# Bantam Hurricanes storm past Streetsville squad

Streetsville Derbies, a new team in the OHA Minor Bantam AAA loop, encountered a hot Hurricane team who beat them 18-0 in the first league game. It was a shooter's night as eight players shared in the goal scoring. Goal scorers were led by Darin Finlayson with four, Danny Haw had a hat trick, Matt Rimmer, Tom Baynton, Peter Mashinter, Steven Roy, and Robert Haringo each had two, while a single marker went to Matt Vervoorn. Needless to say goalies Jeff Langille and Geoff Beauparlant had a quiet night in the net. Assists were by Curtis Carr (2), Haringo (2), Mashinter (2), Doug Janjevich, Haw, Finlayson, Roy and Rimmer.

This year's team is proudly sponsored by JDC Computer Systems of Orangeville. The roster was bolstered by the addition of three new players, Matt Rimmer, Danny Haw and Robert Haringo. Orangeville's Matt Rimmer joins the team from the MTHL Mississauga Reps where he was their top scorer and adds speed, competitiveness and is not afraid to mix it up. Danny Haw is a goal scoring speedster from Hillsburgh who tore up the A league last year. Defenceman Robert Haringo from Milton has a size with aggressiveness and possesses a murderous slap shot.

Returnees on defence are Matt Vervoorn from Waterdown who is one of the hardest hitters on the team; Jon Atley comes from the same corner of Halton, Flamboro and he skates faster backwards than most players do forward; Ryan Taylor of Georgetown is a veteran who covers his zone superbly and is one of the best poke checkers in the league; big Richard Trotter from Erin uses his size to clear the front of the net and possesses a great slap shot; Stuart Colvin of Milton rounds out the six defencemen and has moved from winger to defence to use his excellent ability to cover the ice.

The two veteran goalies Geoff Beauparlant of Georgetown and Jeff Langille from Milton are back to anchor the nets. Geoff is a top positional goalie who plays the angles beautifully. Jeff's size and mobility consistently frustrate the league's sharp shooters.

The well-balanced forward lines

have some unique changes this year. Milton's Doug Janjevich centres a line of Hillsburgh boys, Danny Haw (RW) and Curtis Carr (LW). Doug brings quickness and superb playmaking fleet Curtis is an excellent opportunist around the opposing net. Matt Rimmer centres the Milton line of RW Tom Baynton and LW Steven Roy. Tom has super speed, loves to hit and has excelled in his move from defence to forward. Steven, a good puckhandler, is another top stickman around the net and this feisty trio should create havoc for the opposition. Rangy Justin Davis of Carlisle centres the Georgetown duo of Darin Finlayson (RW) and Peter Mashinter (LW). This line

was in place before and they are comfortable together. Justin is another great playmaker who has an uncanny ability to rag the puck and find the corners of the net. Darin is a deft passer and a tough two-way player who gets his share of key goals. Swift Peter is a 110 percenter who loves the heavy going and uses every chance around the net.

Head coach is John Mallany of Milton who was assistant last year, and feels the team will challenge for the league title and any tournament they are in. Assistant coach is newcomer Kevin Elkins of Milton who will work on offence. Second year manager is Dave Carr of Georgetown.

## Novices extend streak with two more victories

One minute and a half into the third, Mark Fantegrossi tied the game by shoving into the open left corner the rebound of Kevin Binsell's shot. Less than two minutes later, in another pretty

rebound play, Brandon Valente shot the winning goal into the right corner from McCulloch's shot. In the winning 3-2 effort, credit also goes to goaltender Ryan LaRose's steady performance as the Raiders were outshot 21-14.

On Sunday in Dundas, the Raiders' offensive output was prolific as they blew out the home team, 10-3. Coach Paul LaRose said his players "played their best game offensively with lots of good passing."

Goal scorers were Kyle Hotham with a hat trick, Graham McCulloch with two goals, and Chris Henderson, Bradley Snow, Ronny Larocque, Ryan Busby and Corey Forbes each with singles. Triple assists were earned by McCulloch, while Busby, Henderson, Valente, Snow and Tim Mansfield picked up doubles. Hotham and Binsell each had single-helpers.
