All-star goaltender to play this weekend Giurello is back with Raiders club

The Georgetown Chrysler Raiders will have a familiar face in Hockey League team signed goal-

However, he began the season trying to earn a roster spot with the Ontario Hockey League's Sudbury Wolves, but was released just after the start of the 1992-93 campaign. He returned to the Raiders a couple of weeks ago, but didn't sign on immediately because he couldn't be guaranteed playing time. When the Ottawa 67s of the OHL had injuries to their goaltending corps, Giurello spent the weekend with the team. However, Giurello was back with the Raiders at Tuesday night's practice and signed a card with the Georgetown club. To make room for Giurello, the Raiders have given backup goaltender Jamie Szyc permission to skate with any club of his choosing. The addition of Giurello should bolster a position that was a sore point this past weekend. Szyc and goals in three defeats, which

"I can't say anything to discredit Jamie because he did everything we asked of him," Raider general manager Finn Poulstrup said. "It's just that when you have an opportunity at getting two No. 1 goalies, what do you do.'

"Getting Carm is bitter-sweet," Hanman said. "On one hand I'm glad because Carm is a good goaltender and I know what he can do.

"On the other hand, having to let Jamie go is hard because he's an awful nice person to have on your team. But right now we've got two No. 1 goalies and it's time to establish something.'

Hanman said Giurello was scheduled to have played in the Raiders game Friday night in Milton. If Giurello plays well there, he will get the starting nod for tonight's home game against the Oakville Blades (faceoff time at Alcott Arena is 7:30 p.m.). However, Hanman said that's not to suggest Giurello has the starting job merely be default.

"I have two goalies and I'll play the one who can do the job,' Hanman said. "All I'm asking is that they stop the puck."

When Giurello first arrived here after failing to catch on in Sudbury, there was talk that, with three quality goaltenders in camp, the Raiders could possibly trade a netminder for an experienced defenceman. With a blueline corps that features four first-year players, such a deal would've been tailor made.

But Poulstrup said the teams he talked with wanted too much in

"It seems to me that the majority of people wanted a good player but not in a situation where they had to give up something in return," he said. "It would've been nice, but really I didn't expect to get a No. 1 defenceman."

Still, Hanman is looking forward to the weekend contests. The team captains organized a players-only team meeting Tuesday night, and proceeded to have their best practice of the season, the coach said.

He's hoping that will carry on to the two games.

"I was really pleased with Tuesday's practice," Hanman said. "I think the players realize the only way we're going to get out of this is by continuing to work hard because there's no magic formula.

"We're coming off a horrendous week and a half. All we can do is get better one week at a time."
