Water, sewer rates stay low

Halton Region plans to tap into its rate stabilization expected to stay at the 1992 level of \$72.03. reserve fund to keep water and sewage bills low next

Water and wastewater bills are expected to go up 0.62 per cent, while garbage collection fees for 1993 will remain the same under budget estimates released by the region.

The average Halton resident, who paid \$356.89 for water and wastewater in 1992 can expect to pay an additional \$2.75 in 1993. The waste management (garbage collection) fee for the same resident is

Budget documents say water utility rates are being kept low with the help of \$633,000 from the rate stabilization reserve, a rainy day fund which has been built up over the past seven years.

The figures are contained in the 1993 preliminary rate supported budget approved last week by the region's planning and public works committee. The estimates will have to be passed by the budget committee and ratified by Halton Council.
