## Roger Ebert's Video Alert

**HIGH HEELS** (no MPAA rating, 115 m., 1991) is the best recent film by the stylish Spanish director Pedro Almodovar, who weaves a tangled web involving an actress, her daughter, and the various men, women and transvestites in their lives. All flash and flamboyant style and lurid melodrama. Rating: ★★★.

**SISTER ACT** (PG, 100 m., 1992) is a promising story, well acted, badly directed. Whoopi Goldberg stars as a Reno lounge singer who witnesses a murder and is parked in a convent under the witness protection program. Despite the doubts of Mother Superior Maggie Smith, she turns into a passable nun and a great choir director. But the direction lacks zest for the material. Rating: ★★1/2

**PASSED AWAY** (PG-13, 96 m., 1992) begins with a death and then introduces the huge Scanlan family at an Irish-American wake, where everyone's problems are revealed, and most of them are solved. Too many characters, who awkwardly alternate between the funny and the heartwarming. With Bob Hoskins, Maureen Stapleton, William Petersen, Pamela Reed, Tim Curry,

Blair Brown. Rating:★★.  
**UNIVERSAL SOLDIER** (R. 98 m., 1992) begins in Vietnam, where Jean-Claude Van Damme and Dolph Lundgren become blood enemies. After they kill each other, their bodies are frozen, to be reactivated in a government experiment 25 years later. Now they are deadly UniSols — android combat units. But then comb at flashbacks reawaken their old hatred, and TV reporter Ally Walker is caught in the middle. She gives a terrific per-

formance; the rest of the movie is high tech action, often laughable. Rating:★★.  
**ALIEN 3** (R, 105 m., 1992) is a great-looking bad movie, a triumph of art and set work and special effects but a failure of imagination, as Ripley (Sigourney Weaver) crashlands on a prison planet in a lifeboat that also contains the implacable creature she has battled for years. The script is thin, repetitive and unforgivably drawn-out. Rating: ★1/2
