Officers assaulted

the suspect who began to calm

The officer walked the man to a nearby police cruiser and informed him he was under arrest for causing a disturbance.

The man "became agitate" and pushed the police officer up against her cruiser. Cst. AL Stennet arrived and went to the assistance of the other officer.

According to police, the man was warned not to resist arrest but continued to struggle with the officers become more violent as the arrest progressed.

When the officers tried to place the Oakville man in the rear of a police cruiser, he kicked Cst. Stennet on the side of the head and then on the left side of his face.

The man was wearing square-toe western boots, police added.

Once in the rear of the cruiser the man refused to clam down and began kicking at the rear, driverside window. The window eventually shattered. As officers drove the man to the Georgetown detachment to complete the arrest he kicked out the remaining windows in the rear of the cruiser. Police added that the rear door frames were bent from the man's actions. Damage was estimated at \$1,500.

The man, 24, has been charged with causing a disturbance, assault, two counts of assaulting a police officer, resisting arrest and mischief over \$1,000. He was set to appear for a bail hearing Monday in Milton.
