

Novices win pair, lose one

The Beaver Lumber Major Novices played three games this past week and elevated their record to 15-1-4.

Last Thursday night the Raiders played in Flamboro where they beat the hometown squad 5-1.

Although Flamboro was first to score midway into the opening period, Georgetown quickly responded fifteen seconds later when Corey Forbes tied it up, assisted by Chris Henderson and Kevin Binsell. A full period later, the Raiders came alive as they collected three goals within 32 seconds. Mark Fantegrossi snapped the 1-1 tie with a powerplay goal set up by Graham McCulloch and Marty Lefebvre. In what appeared to be an instant replay, sixteen seconds later, Fantegrossi again connected with another powerplay goal from McCulloch and Brad Snow. Then, again sixteen seconds later, Brandon Valente gave the Raiders a 2-goal edge when he targeted the top for corner, with Ronny Larocque and Tim Mansfield assisting on the play.

In the opening seconds of the third, Lefebvre collected an unassisted goal for a 5-1 final. Goalie Ryan LaRose was steady in net, stopping 21 shots. After the game, a pleased Coach Paul LaRose com-

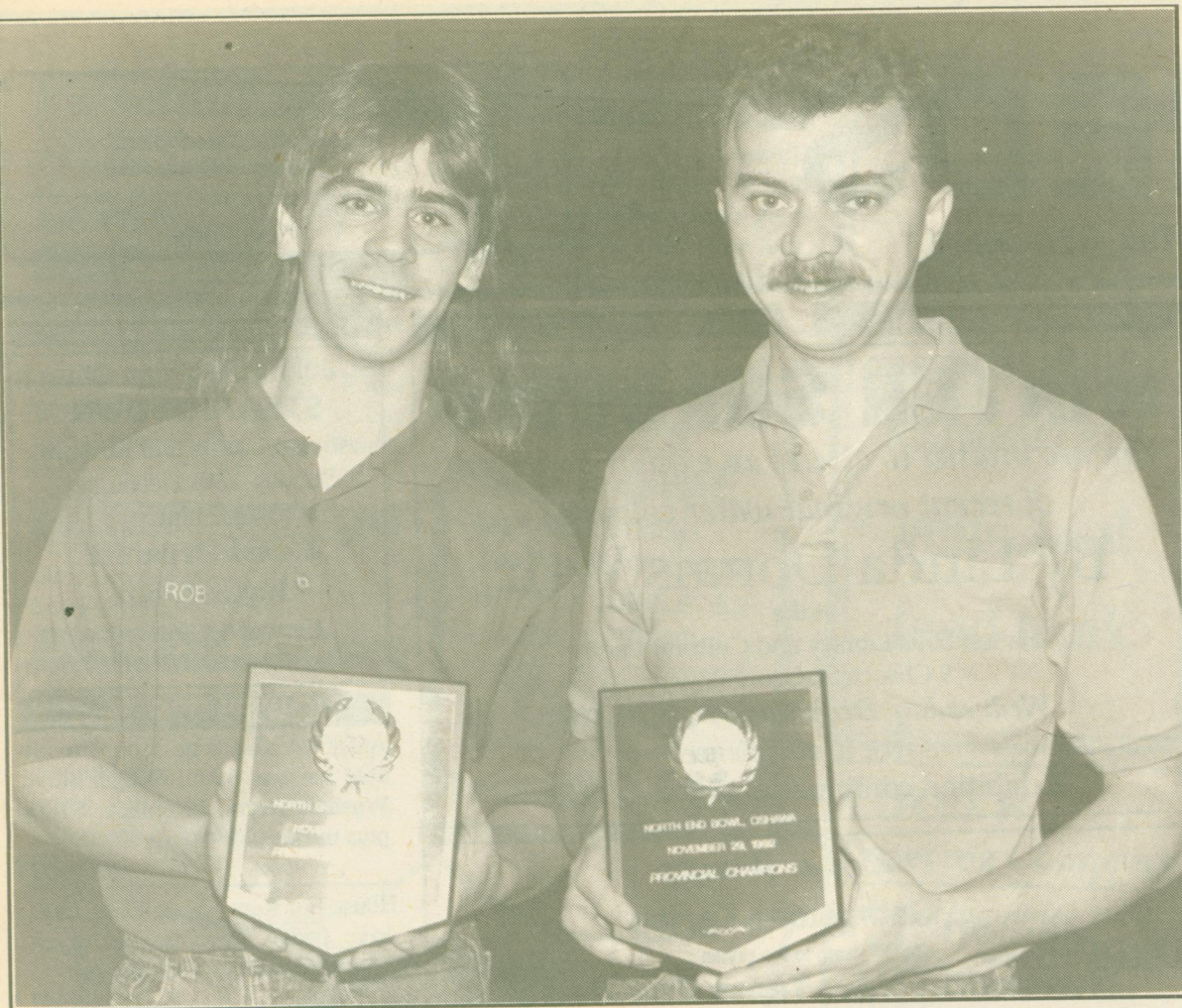
mented about his players, "I liked their hustle and their control of the other zone, and especially the ability of defense to rush the play at the right moments."

On Saturday at home at Memorial Arena, the Raiders crushed visiting Dundas 8-1. Defenceman Tim Mansfield continued his hustle from the previous game and made an unexpected contribution to the Georgetown attack, as he scored his first goal of the season and also notched two assists.

Raider goal scorers were McCulloch with two, while Fantegrossi, Mansfield, Forbes, Snow, Larocque and Valente all had single goals. Drawing assists were Binsell, Mansfield and Ryan Field with doubles, and Alex Durham, Fantegrossi, Forbes, Snow and Ryan Busby with single helpers.

On Sunday in Hamilton, the Raiders experienced their first season loss after twenty games, as they were edged 4-3. The Raiders finally got their offence together in the final period when they rallied with three goals. McCulloch took Snow's pass and flipped the puck high to the far corner. Valente sliced the margin to within one, when he capitalized on Larocque's pass, but the last-minute heroics wasn't enough for the Raiders to continue their streak.
