 Regular Guy, a freshman son of Frugal Gourmet was the best in the \$19,400 Count B Pacing Series Final defeating Ritchies Imperial and Daylon Crusoe.

Driven by Roger Mayotte for trainer-part-owner Ed McHale, co-owners Darrell Munro John Macere and William Thornton, Regular Guy clocked a lifetime best 1:55.3 performance.

"He really paced down the backstretch," said McHale, "when I saw Cassys Success had the lead down the backstretch, I thought my horse would just eat him up."

Regular Guy was a \$15,000 yearling purchase at the Canadian Classic Sale and was the toughest yearling McHale's ever had to break.

According to his connections, they purchased him because he

resembled Die Laughing quite a bit and they remember how well he (Die Laughing) raced against their colt Whiteland Trouble during the stakes campaign of '91.

"He's great now though, he's come a long way. He's a high speed horse who has a big heart," says McHale.

With the win, his 7th in 13 starts, Regular Guy banked \$38,467 on the year for his owners and will be looking to numerous stake engage-

ments in '93.
 The horses will be "off and pacing" Friday at 7:30 p.m. for the first race as Ontario Jockey Club harness racing moves back to Greenwood for the winter meet.

Fans will enjoy \$1 General Admission and a Free Program on opening night and intertrack wagering will be available at Woodbine, Mohawk and Fort Erie.

Racing programs will operate five times a week - Mondays,

Thursdays, and Fridays, with a 7:30 p.m. post time and Saturdays and Sundays with a 1:30 p.m. post time, through to Saturday, March 20, 1993.

For the first time, racing fans will view the harness races under the new stadium lighting system that was installed prior to the thoroughbred fall meet.
