Youth makes suicide attempt in custody

A 17-year-old Acton youth attempted suicide while waiting for a bail hearing at a Milton Court

The youth was rushed to Milton District Hospital where he was treated and released.

According to Halton Regional Police, the youth was charged with two counts of sexual assault last week after police investigated allegations by a pair of female students at the Acton High School.

In one case a male student "lured the victim into a private area of the school on the pretext of having a conversation.'

Once there the male attempted to undress the victim and force her head into his lap.

The assaults took place between Nov. 16 and Nov. 20 police said. The youth is set to make another court appearance in March.

Meanwhile, the youth's sister has been charged with two counts of threatening bodily harm and obstructing justice after the alleged victims were threatened.

The female is set to appear in court January 15.

drycleaning. Drycleaning is simply the use of solvents to remove soil and stains from fabrics. It is called "drycleaning" because the solvents contain little or no water and do not penetrate the fibers as water

Drycleaning solvents are fluids that actually dissolve greases and oils and remove them from the garment. Water by itself cannot do this. Natural fibers such as wools and silks can shrink, distort, and lose color when washed

There is no mystery about in water, but will dryclean beautifully. Synthetic fibers such as

> polyesters also respond well to drycleaning. These fibers can retain oily stains after washing, but drycleaning will remove such stains.

A drycleaning machine looks much like a very large front loading home washer. It produces similar mechanical action to loosen embedded dirt. At the same time the solvent is filtered continuously to insure its clarity.


