Police beat

Teen attacked

Police in Georgetown are continuing their investigation into an attack on a 17-year-old Friday.

The youth and two friends were travelling along Stuart McLaren Dr., Georgetown when they noticed a group of girls. They stopped to talk to the girls but one of the females became frightened and ran to tell her father.

When the 30-year-old man came

out of the house, the victim fled with a friend in a car. The suspect and a neighbor pursued the pair and ran them off the road on River Rd.

The suspect removed a stick from the rear of his van and began hitting the car with the stick and kicking the car. He was screaming for the victim to get out of the vehicle.

When the victim got out of the car the suspect hit him with the stick, punched and kicked him.

The second suspect, a 27-yearold put the victim in a headlock and punched him until the victim managed to escape.
