being held today (Jan. 20) in Oakville. The meeting will determine the parties who will be involved in a full-scale hearing to be held at a later date.

Plans by Coscan Developments to build a 200-home subdivision and 74,600-square-foot commercial plaza in Acton East will be the subject of a future hearing. Also slated for discussion at a future hearing are objections to the the town's Official Plan relating to some land designations in the Acton Urban Area.

Elliott said that he and Councillors Bonnette and Rennie, "for the most part, support East Acton development."

A decision by town council to support the Acton studies would give more weight to council's position at the OMB, he argued.

"I feel we're leaving something off the table without making a decision tonight," he said.

Rennie said he understood that endorsement of the Implementation Plan "would shorten up the hearing." He later indicated his willingness to support both studies at Thursday's meeting.

Bonnette supported comments made by Elliott and Rennie. "I think we can deal with it tonight," he said.

He also said he would prefer that the Acton studies were separated from the Georgetown report.

Council, as a whole, however, chose to delay approval of the studies after being assured by deputy planning director Bruce MacLean that legal advice had been received and it wasn't necessary that the reports be adopted before today's pre-hearing.

While supporting further debate of the studies, Councillor Gail Rutherford suggested that the Acton studies should be dealt with as quickly as possible in preparation for the upcoming hearings.

Councillor Pam Johnston voiced similar thinking.

"I kind of agree we could deal with the Acton part this evening," she said. "It's important to get on with this as quickly as possible," she added.

"I feel costs at the hearing would be lower" if council adopts the planning reports, Johnston maintained

staff and waive the fee, she asked that staff report back next week about the possible "repercussions" of council's action. "If it's precedent-setting, I'm concerned about it. We're going to get behind the eight-ball in the collection of cash for recreational purposes," she warned.

However, Councillors Norm Elliott and Gail Rutherford argued that the re-zoning application doesn't represent a major change in land use and, as a result, the parkland fee shouldn't be required.

"If it's precedent setting, I can't think of a better precedent to set," Councillor Rick Bonnette remarked.

Mayor Russ Miller, who also supported waiving the fee, agreed with Sarjeantson. "I think we should have it on record that we did question it," he said.

The decision went against a staff recommendation that the fee should be collected.
