

Showtime for Rotary fundraiser

It's showtime, folks.

Literally. This Saturday the Rotary Club of Georgetown presents the group Showtime at the John Elliott Theatre in Georgetown. There will be two performances, a matinee at 2 p.m. and an evening performance at 7:30 p.m.

They performed in Georgetown last year in a benefit performance for Georgetown Little Theatre. They have also opened for Max Bygraves and performed with the

Hamilton Symphony and at Ontario Place.

"You'll come away feeling good...feeling spirited," said Rotarian past president Barry Timleck. "You'll know you've done something to continue with the Ralph Ursel Foundation. It's also good value for the money."

Tickets are \$22 for the evening performance and \$12 for the matinee.


