Gut check time for Raiders as season winds down

It's gut-check time for the Georgetown Chrysler Raiders heading into the homestretch of the Central Ontario Junior A West Division 1992-93 regular season.

Raiders have only six games left in the regular season and are involved in a dogfight with Royal York Rangers for the seventh, and final playoff spot in the eight team loop.

At press time, the Raiders and the Rangers were tied for the seventh and final playoff berth (both with 16 points) but the Raiders have only six games to play while Rangers have seven.

The Raiders turned aside the

Rangers 5-4 last Saturday at Alcott arena before the largest home crowd of the year to knot at 16 points with the Royal York crew - the Raiders' third win in their past five outings.

GRIPS - Part III

When determining the style of your golf grip you must be aware of the different types of material that are available in the golf grip industry today. The golf grip has come a long way from the original grips designed by the "fathers" of golf. Initial grip material included wrappings of padded cloth or a crude winding of leather. Due to technology golfers today have a greater amount of flexibility when selecting the style and material of their grips.

Leather is still the most classic material used in regards to feel and appearance. It has a long life span and if tanned properly is not affected by the environment. Although leather will last longer than other materials it will become very hard and slick after a period of time. When dry leather is excellent but when wet it becomes slippery and you could lose some control. Like all leather products leather grips can be expensive. Natural Rubber is still the most popular material used in golf grips. While natural rubber grips perform very well they don't last very long under the strains of everyday golfing. Weather has an adverse effect on the rubber grip and it is also affected by the ozone which causes it to crack. Synthetic rubber compounds are used by many manufacturers which help prevent the deterioration of the grip over a longer period of time from the weather, sunlight, and the ozone.

Kraton is a new material used in the manufacturing of golf grips. It has a rubber like property but is derived from an entirely different process than synthetic rubber compounds. Kraton is totally resistant to the ozone and ultraviolet rays. It outlasts rubber and maintains its tacky feel for the life of the grip.
