**GRIPS - Part III** 

When determining the style of your golf grip you ust be aware of the different types of materia that are available in the golf grip industry today. The golf grip has come a long way from the original grips designed by the "fathers" of golf. Initial grip material included wrappings of padded cloth or a crude winding of leather. Due to technology golfers today have a greater amount of flexibility when selecting the style and material of their grips.

Leather is still the most classic material used in regards to feel and appearance. It has a long life span and if tanned properly is not affected by the environment. Although leather will last longer than other materials it will become very hard and slick after a period of time. When dry leather is excellent but when wet it becomes slippery and you could lose some control. Like all leather products leather grips can be expensive. Natural Rubber is still the most popular material used in golf grips. While-natmost popular material used myol grips. While hat very long under the strains of everyday golfing. Weather has an adverse effect on the rubber grip and it is also effected by the ozone which causes it. to crack. Synthetic rubber compounds are used by many manufacturers which help prevent the deteri-oration of the grip over a longer period of time from the weather, sunlight, and the ozone.

Kraton is a new material used in the manufactur

ing of golf grips. It has a rubber like property but is derived from an entirely different process than syn-thetic rubber compounds. Kraton is totally resistant to the ozone and ultraviolet rays. It outlasts rubber and maintains its tacky feel for the life of the grip.
