grant has come through," Heaton said, acknowledging Duignan's work on the town's behalf. However, Heaton said he knows some Glen residents are concerned about the costs.

The total cost of the watermain project is pegged at \$1.6 million. The provincial grant will cover 60 per cent of the cost, with Halton Region kicking in 25 per cent and watermain users providing the remaining monies, a regional public works official explained Tuesday during a telephone interview.

Linda Petelka, budget and development co-ordinator for the regional public works department, didn't have figures immediately available

to provide an estimated cost for the average Glen Williams household tapping into the system. However, she said homeowners were given an estimate of the costs involved during a public meeting in the hamlet last November.

In accordance with the provisions of The Municipal Act, pursuant to By-Law 93-011 adopted by Council on January 25th, 1993, the first two installments of taxes for 1993 will become due as follows:

ALL WARDS FIRST INSTALLMENT - WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 24TH, 1993 - SECOND INSTALLMENT - WEDNESDAY, APRIL 28TH, 1993

The above installments represent an interim billing for 1993 taxes based upon an average of one-half of last year's residential mill rates. The final tax bill will be issued about the middle of the year and will also be payable in two installments, Monday, June 28th and Tuesday, September 28th.

A penalty of 1 1/4% will be charged on the first day of each calendar month until taxes are paid.

Failure to receive a Tax Bill does not excuse the property owner or business operator from responsibility for payment, nor relieve him/her from liability of penalty for late payment.

Ratepayers who have not received a Tax Bill should make immediate application at 1 Halton Hills Drive, Halton Hills (Georgetown),

Taxes for the year 1993 may be paid at the Finance Department (1 Halton Hills Drive, Georgetown); Hydro Office (43 Alice Street, Acton), or any branch of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce located within the Town of Halton Hills subject to a service charge. Past due installments and arrears of taxes must be paid at the Finance Department.
