# Income tax time again

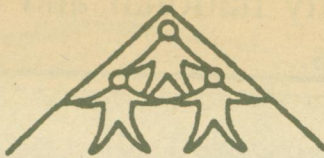
### Government mistake

For those of you who do your own returns please note the TIC (ONT) form has a mistake. In section 1 entitled Ontario Income Tax, the first line reads Basic Federal Tax (from tax Table A... It should read (Line 406 from pg 4 of General Return or line 506 on Schedule 1).

### Seniors note this change

Seniors must apply for their Property and Sales Tax Credits as well as Goods and Services Tax with the Income Tax forms this year. To get the property and Sales Tax Credit you use The TIC (ONT) Seniors form. If you receive the T165 plus tax return, you do not need to complete the above mentioned form as the Property Tax is included on this return and Revenue Canada will automatically calculate the Sales Tax Credit for you.

The amount you will get will depend on your net income, the number of people in your household and the rent or property tax you pay. The maximum Property and Sales Tax Credit is \$1,000.



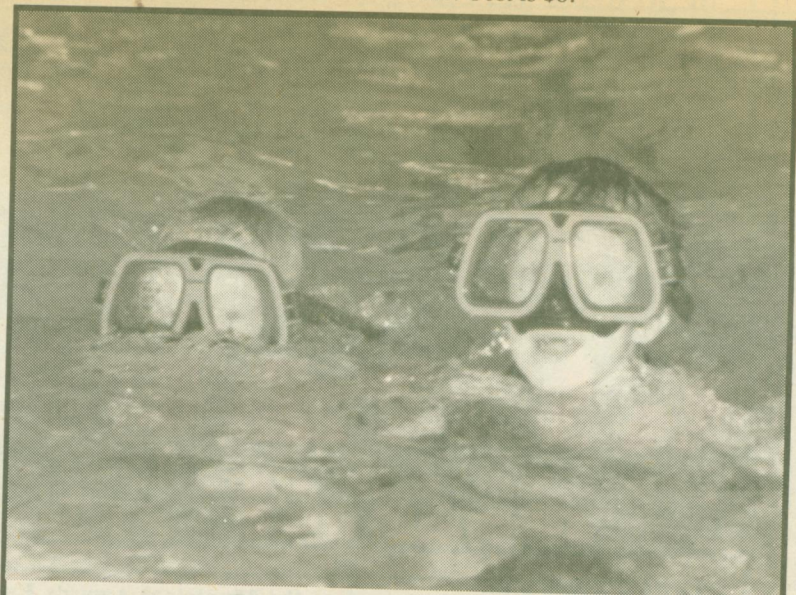
Assic clinic for low income families/seniors

Nobody likes paying taxes, but we all enjoy getting a refund! Property and Sales Tax Credits, Goods and Services rebates and Child Tax Credits may be due if you are in a lower income bracket.

For those families with income less than \$30,000, couples less than \$20,500 and singles less than \$15,000, free clinics will be held at Acton Social Services and Information Centre during March. Appointments may be booked by calling Acton Social Services and Information Centre, 853-3310.
