enth - and final - playoff berth in the Central Ontario Junior A West Division eight team loop. Raiders have won four of their last six games.

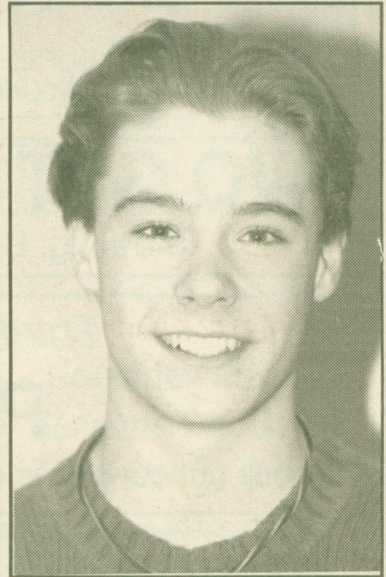
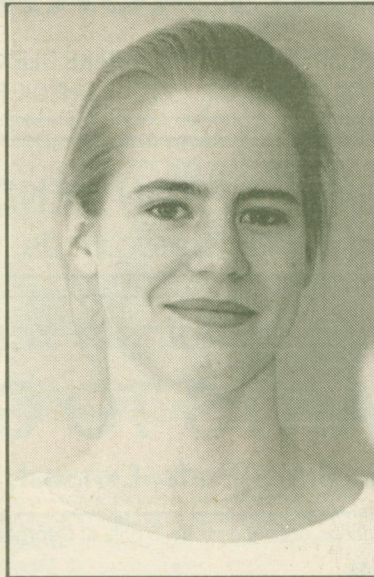

Bodanis Raiders advance in O.M.H.A. '93 playdowns

On Feb. 10, the Georgetown Bodanis Bantam Raiders travelled south to Simcoe's Talbot Gardens arena for game four of their best-of-five zone finals with the Simcoe Lions and came home triumphant.

Going into the game Georgetown held a two-games-to-one edge in the series and in dramatic fashion the series three-games-to-one and earn a berth into the Bantam "A" O.M.H.A. quarterfinals.

The series opened on Feb. 6 at Georgetown's Alcott arena. The matinee game started cautiously with both sides looking for the others strengths and weaknesses.

Georgetown opened the scoring at 4:21 of the first, went up 3 - 1 late in the second, allowed Simcoe back into the game early in the third but finished them off with two goals late in the period for a 5 - 3 final and a 1 - 0 lead in the series.
