I was writing about markers a few weeks ago. Here's a thought or two for throwers. Players are supposed to throw from either on the line or behind the line as set up for play. Many players are guilty of placing their feet in such a manner as to be over the line at the time of throwing. Any such throw may be declared illegal by the marker and not allowed replay or counted. Players are their own judges and should take care to ensure that they are behind the line, or on, but not in front of the line prior to throwing.
