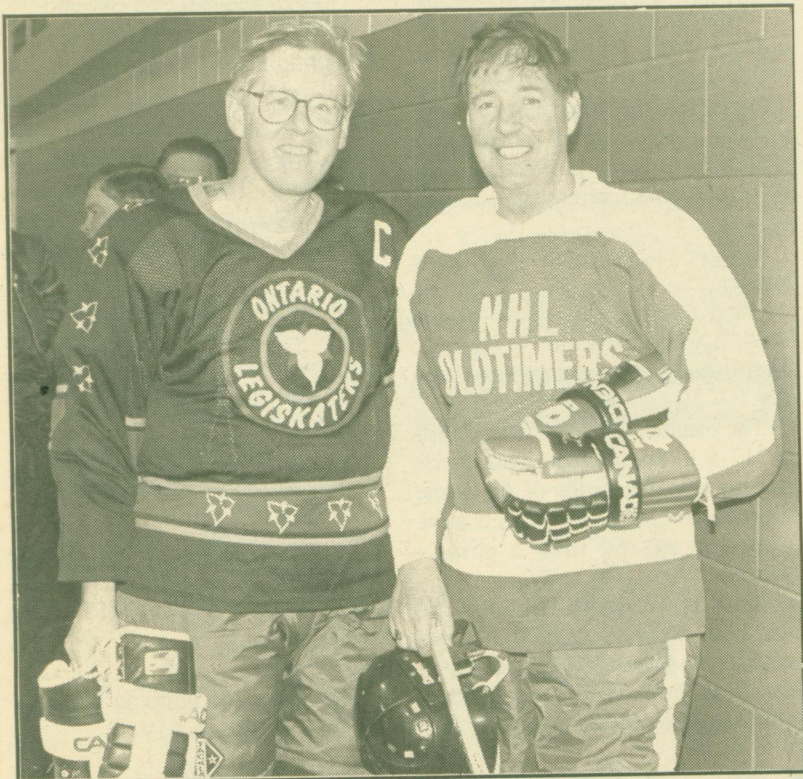

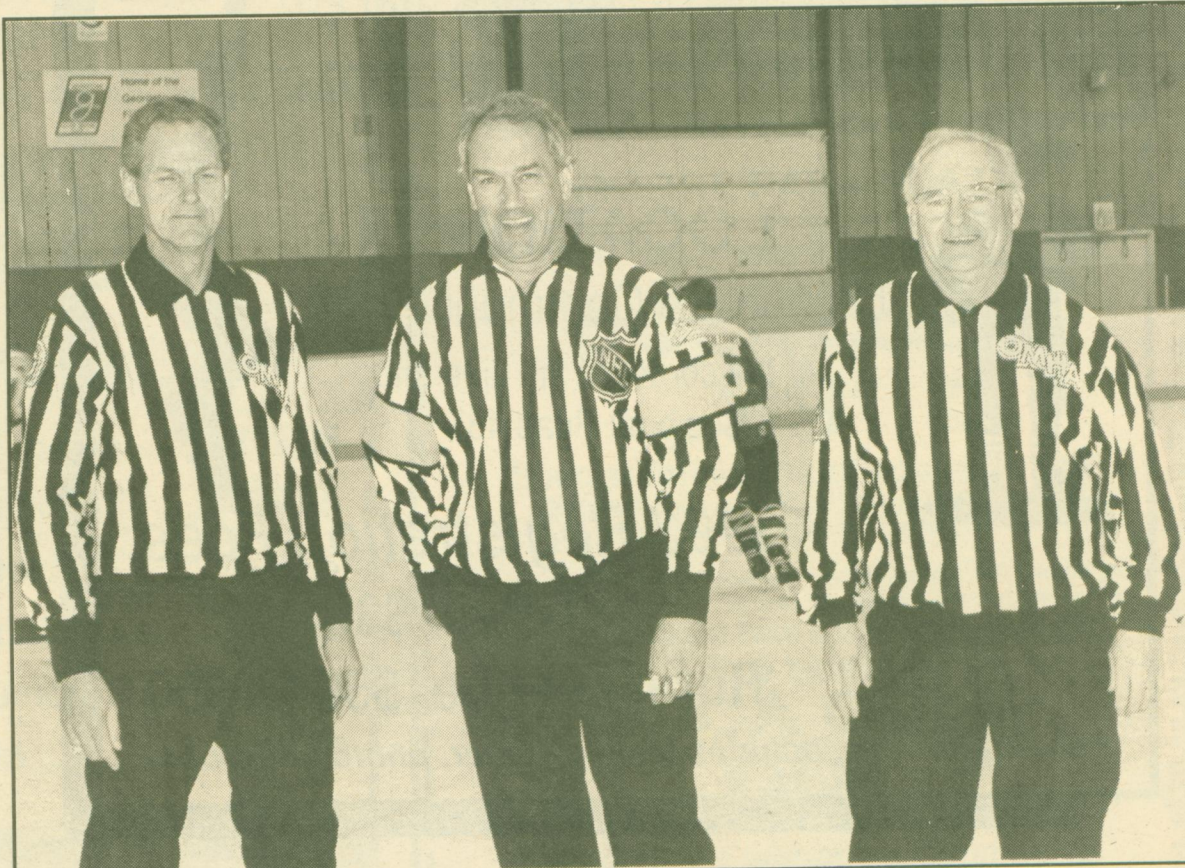
## Cystic Fibrosis and Georgetown hospital benefit from charity hockey game
