

Committee formed to discuss NAFTA

If you've been waiting for a chance to discuss the North American Free Trade Agreement, six members of the provincial legislature will be waiting for your comments.

The Cabinet Committee on North American Free Trade was formed to provide people across Ontario with an opportunity to express and clarify concerns about the proposed NAFTA. Its members will be traveling throughout the province to listen to your opinions and, as part of making recommendations to Cabinet, to make the provincial

government aware of those views and concerns. A central purpose of this committee is to help in the formulation of alternatives to NAFTA.

Although the negotiation of trade agreements is within the jurisdiction of the federal government, Ontario has a critical interest in trade issues due to the central importance of trade to the provincial economy. And NAFTA will have major implications for our province. So even though we're

opposed to the North American Free Trade Agreement, we intend to act forcefully to defend and promote the province's economic interests in this field as in other areas. The Cabinet Committee is part of this process.

The group is chaired by Elmer Buchanan, Minister of Agriculture and Food. The other members are Howard Hampton, Minister of Natural Resources, Shirley Coppen,

Minister without Portfolio for Culture, Tourism and Recreation; Gilles Bisson, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Northern Development and Mines

after which a public report will be issued.

A firm schedule of locations for the hearings will soon be in place. Two toll-free numbers have been established so that Ontarians can find out about the committee's travel schedule, how to participate in the hearings, or how to make a written submission to the committee.
