for a ride on one of the Great Little Trains of Wales. For over a century, the narrow-gauge railways hauled slate from the quarries in Wales. The Ffestiniog Line is the longest in Britain and re-opened as a passenger service, with the willing help of railway enthusiasts, in 1955. Many of the trains are pulled by unique and historic steam locomotives. From the coastline at Porthmadog, the little train climbs through tranquil pastures and magnificent forests, past lakes and waterfalls, round horseshoe bends and even a complete spiral, sometimes clinging to the side of the mountain and sometimes tunneling under it. Much of the area is so remote that there are not even any roads and the trains stop occasionally at isolated cottages whose inhabitants depend entirely on the railway. An hour and 13 1/2 miles later, the train arrives at the old mining town of Blaenau Ffestiniog, 700 feet above sea level. This memorable journey is yet another highlight of our Best of the British Isles tour departing August 6th.


There is a euchre happening this
