The number of House Leagues for '93 has been expanded from five to seven. This does not reflect an increase in numbers, but rather, an attempt to lessen the age-spread previously seen in two of the Leagues.

Last year's T-Ball League carried players aged 5, 6 and 7-years. For the '93 season there will be a Jr. T-Ball League for 5 and 6-year-olds and a Sr. T-Ball League for 7-year-old players.

The G.B.A. hopes the Bantam/Midget/Juvenile League of

the past can be split, creating a Bantam League for 14 and 15-year-old players and a Midget/Juvenile League for players 16-to-19. At this point, registration numbers are low at the Midget/Juvenile ages and the desirable split is in doubt.
