

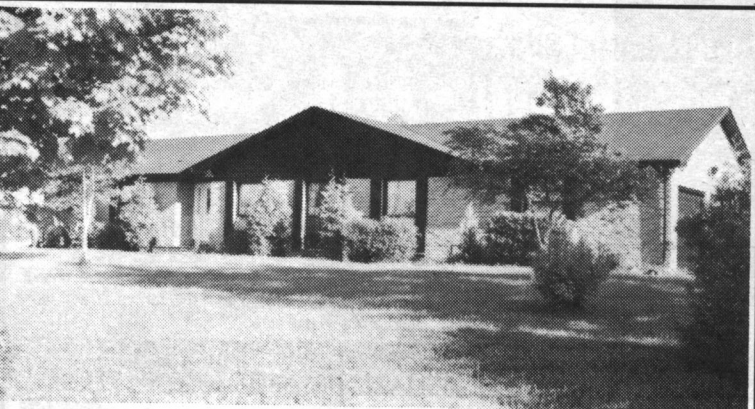

 her concerns about exclusion of the 401 corridor from the preferred urban expansion development option during Wednesday's regional council meeting. At the special meeting of planning and public works earlier in the day, she also reacted to the exclusion of Acton from maps in the reports.

Asking questions about a section of one of the reports dealing with waste water servicing expansion for future growth, Serjeantson pointed out Acton's absence from a map of water pollution control plant sites in Halton. She asked about the possibility of increasing the plant's capacity by using the effluent for irrigation.

Consultant Anderson suggested the quality of effluent determines whether or not it can be used for irrigation purposes.

Halton Hills planning director Ian Keith, who attended the special meeting, reacted more cautiously to the ongoing study. "It would be a

mistake to react too quickly," he said. "I haven't studied it (the report) in depth."

Keith described the consultants doing the study as "high-class" and said he believes they are making "a very good attempt to come to grips with pressures associated with accommodating future growth" in Halton. However, he does have some concerns about the deletion of the 401 corridor from the study team's preferred development

option. "I find its deletion or elimination, a troublesome notion," he said, adding that opportunities for revisions to the study still remain. "Whether the final plan is implemented as suggested remains to be seen," he concluded.

A presentation of the review's findings to date will be made to Halton Hills Council April 26. There will also be opportunities for public input at other meetings held throughout the region.

Official Plan discussed

A public meeting was held Wednesday night at the Georgetown District High School so that local residents could voice concerns over the proposed changes to Halton Region's Official Plan.

The 20-year plan is reviewed every five years and amendments are introduced if necessary.

The meeting was attended by the members of the region's Planning and Development Department, Halton Hills councillors, and approximately 15 residents. Most of the issues raised related to the environment and the rapid growth of the town.

Several individuals voiced concerns about the Niagara Escarpment issue. At a regional

council meeting, held earlier in the day, it was decided the region would request control over the escarpment from the provincial government.

"These people are worried that if the region takes over, rules will be relaxed. The same standard of development will not be maintained," explained Ho Wong, director of policy research and planning services for the region.

This was one of eight open house meetings which have been, or still will be, held. The next one is scheduled for Wednesday, 6 p.m. at Acton High School.

Proposed changes to the Official Plan are not expected to be presented to regional council until the fall.

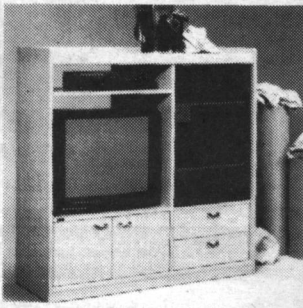
