Journey back a thousand years

Jorvik is the Viking city that archaeologists uncovered beneath Coppergate, York in Northeast England. Then, round a corner, you find yourself in the archaeological dig itself, reconstructed exactly where it took place, with the preserved tenth century buildings re-erected where they were found. From there, you pass to the Skipper Gallery to see the many magnificent and delicate objects found on the dig. All of this makes the Jorvik Viking Centre not just the journey of a lifetime, but the most exciting one in a thousand years!
