Marion Boyd, the newly appointed Attorney General of Ontario, is now using the power of injunctions to forbid any form of protest against abortion on demand.

She is using the recent killing of a doctor in Florida and the bombing of the Morgentaler clinic in Toronto as an excuse to muzzle the groups opposing the NDP on the abortion issue. In reality, the only violence at pro-life demonstrations in Canada has been violence committed against pro-lifers.

It is obvious that injunctions would not have prevented the two recent crimes against abortionists and that injunctions cannot prevent similar crimes in the future. Instead, it is possible that some of the people who are being prevent-

ed from demonstrating peacefully may revert to violence as their only alternative to respond to the continuous killing of unborn children.

This shows how a government, by reverting to unprecedented restrictive measures, can polarize public opinion to the point of creating a situation ripe for more violence.

The NDP is restricting the freedom to picket and the freedom of expression only to appease the loudest activist groups. Which freedoms will the NDP take away next?
